

Rules of Play

- Riverboat Roulette allows players to play the traditional version of roulette while adding the option of making multi-spin wagers on any of six predetermined colored neighborhoods on the roulette wheel.
- Players may wager on any or all of the colored neighborhoods and also on the single-spin white neighborhood.
- All colored neighborhoods are offered as multi-spin wagers and pay odds on winning outcomes.
- White neighborhood bets are single-spin wagers, pay odds on winning wagers, and lose on all other outcomes not resulting in the white neighborhood.
- Non-winning colored neighborhood wagers push and only lose when the outcome results in the white neighborhood -- creating a "multiple-spin" version of roulette.
